## THE JOY OF OBEDIENCE

We live in a culture where joy coupled with obedience is a foreign concept. In a world that often equates happiness with personal freedom or fleeting pleasures, the text of scripture provides a countercultural truth—true joy flows from walking in God's commands. As Christians, we ought to understand this fundamental principle, yet many struggle with the concept of desiring what God desires and doing what honors Him.

We understand that those who reject Christ and reject a biblical understanding of salvation, the gospel, or His word have no true desire for the things of God. We daily wrestle with people who desire their own happiness and are in a constant pursuit of misplaced joy. At the core of the issue is what one might refer to today as a "worship disorder" or better stated in biblical parlance, idolatry.

Thankfully, over the years in ministry, I have witnessed many followers of Christ come to the knowledge and realization of His transforming power. He truly is more desirable than anything this world has to offer. God does a work in us when by faith we believe. And part of that work is to change our desires, affections, and longings. We begin to understand that part of that changed desires is a corresponding obedience—an obedience that is not burdensome but rather a pathway to blessing. Psalm 119:1 says, "Blessed are the undefiled in the way, who walk in the law of the Lord! Blessed are those who keep His testimonies, who seek Him with the whole heart!"

The psalmist uses the word "blessed" to describe a state of deep, abiding happiness. It is not a superficial feeling, but rather a settled joy rooted in God's presence. This blessing comes to those who walk in the law of the Lord, keep His statutes, and who diligently seek Him with their whole heart. Please note the connection between obedience and joy (blessing). There is a direct correlation, and the two are inseparable. When we align our thinking and actions with God's Word, our hearts are transformed, and we experience the delight of living for His glory and honor.

It is true for many that the challenges of life and the persistent demands of our time can cause us great stress and rob us of joy. Additionally, many assume that following God's commands will somehow restrict their freedom or add to their burdens. In reality, the complete opposite is true. As Dr. Kevin Carson says, "Obedience liberates us from the chains of sin and self-reliance; obedience breaks the life-depleting motive of selfishness."

When we choose to trust and obey God's Word, we discover a joy that goes way beyond our circumstances. It is a joy that is settled regardless

of my physical health, financial wherewithal, or even difficult relationships. It is rooted in walking according to His precepts and trusting Him for the results the functionally we have no control overdespite our attempts to manipulate.

Let me suggest three very practical ways in which one can experience joy through obedience:

- 1) Choose to delight in God's word. The writer of Psalm 119:16 says, "I shall delight in Your statutes; I shall not forget Your word." The psalmist finds joy in meditating on Scripture because it reveals God's character and will. For you and me, make time each day to read and reflect on a passage. Ask yourself, "What does this teach me about God? How can I apply it?" As you immerse yourself in Scripture, your love for God's commands will grow, and so will your
- 2) Choose to obey with all your heart. The psalmist prays, "Give me understanding, that I may observe Your law and keep it with all my heart" (Ps 119:34). The direction of our lives is to live in obedience to His precepts. That stems from what drives us including our desires. Obedience is not about perfection but it is about a sincere desire to honor God. Look for a specific way to please God this week by selecting one command from His word and apply it-say gratitude (1 Thess 5:18) or a forgiving spirit (Eph 4:4:32). Ask God to help you apply the commands in all circumstances, especially when you want to do otherwise.
- 3) Choose to pray. The psalmist beseeches the Lord, "I cried with all my heart; answer me, O LORD! I will observe Your statutes. I cried to You: save me And I shall keep Your testimonies" (Ps 119:145-146). When we pray, our hearts are more aligned with the purposes of God. When we acknowledge Him and our desperate need to have Him intervene in our lives, He inclines His ear toward us. As we seek Him, we confess any resistance to obedience and ask for strength to follow His Word. God in His goodness, begins to transforms our desires, making obedience a delight rather than a duty.

As the Psalmist reminds us: keep His word ever before you, obey Him with your whole heart, and continually seek Him above all else. Be encouraged today that obedience to His precepts do not steal your joy; it gives you joy. Think and do the things He requires out of a genuine transformed heart to please Him, and transcendent joy will be yours. "Let us hold fast the confession of our

### Baby Bottle Fundraiser

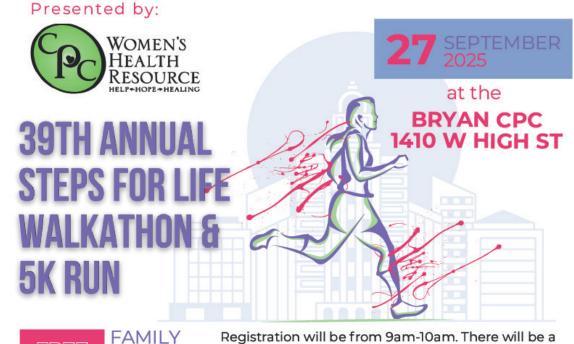
