

OUR MOTIVATION

What motivates you to remain faithful and stay on course in the Christian life?

There are many things that can encourage us and keep us moving forward, but for believers, one of the greatest motivations should be the promised return of our Savior. The Bible's teaching about the end of history and the second coming of Jesus Christ is not intended to preoccupy our curiosity about future events. Rather, it is meant to inspire faithful living in the present and strengthen our commitment to all that Christ has called us to do.

Paul tells us that we are to "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice! Let your gentle spirit be known to all men. The Lord is near. Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all comprehension, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus... The things you have learned and received and heard and seen in me, practice these things, and the God of peace will be with you" (Philippians 4:4-9).

Likewise, Peter reminds believers: "The end of all things is near; therefore, be of sound judgment and sober spirit for the purpose of prayer" (1 Peter 4:7).

The nearness of Christ's return is intended to shape the way we think and live. It should produce joy rather than fear, confidence rather than anxiety, and faithfulness rather than complacency. For Christians, the return of Christ will be a day of great rejoicing as we see our Savior face to face. Yet it will also be a day of judgment for those who have rejected Him.

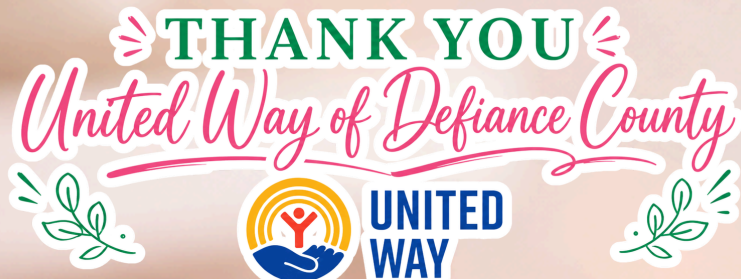
Knowing that Jesus will come again to judge the living and the dead should motivate us to live faithfully. Scripture consistently teaches that Christ will reward those who do the will of the Father, use their gifts for His kingdom, and serve His people with love and devotion.

Peter continues, "Above all, keep fervent in your love for one another, because love covers a multitude of sins" (1 Peter 4:8).

If these things are true, what kind of people should we be? How should we respond?

The genuineness of our faith will be demonstrated by both our beliefs and our behavior. A life transformed by the gospel will increasingly reflect prayerfulness, self-control, love for others, and faithful service. These are the marks of those who are eagerly awaiting their Lord.

The certainty of Christ's return is a confident hope that is to be heartily embraced. It strengthens our faith, steadies our hearts, fuels our obedience, and reminds us that our labor in the Lord is never in vain. As we await His appearing, may we live with joy, pray with confidence, love one another fervently, and remain faithful until He comes.
